- Certificates will be awarded to selected top entries, as assessed by a team of expert reviewers.
- One (1) winning entry, as judged by SEAMEO Secretariat, will receive the **SEAMEO Innovation Award with a monetary prize of USD 500 – 1000**. Submissions under the theme of “Creativity and Development for the 21st Century Learning” are eligible for this award. Possible scopes of education innovation could be pioneering teaching models, co-curricular program, community partnerships, research, ICT in education, innovative clinical experiences etc. (TVET teachers and trainers are highly encouraged to participate).

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Innovation Awardees will be selected based on the principal criteria of:

- **Innovation:** The practice model demonstrates creativity, a deep understanding of the levers and barriers in TVET, and offers a new approach or opportunity related to creativity and development for the 21st century
- **Maturity / Impact:** There is evidence of refinement and iteration of the model over time, proving that the innovation is at a stage of maturity to effectively share lessons learnt, contribute and impact the TVET field.
- **Replication:** The innovation may be adapted without losing quality. Replication may be across different TVET institutions, TVET disciplines or with partner organization.

Supporting criteria include:

- **Trustworthiness:** The practice demonstrates credibility in description and also data sources.
- **Efficiency:** The TVET practice represents 'good value for money' or cost-effectiveness and is well managed with streamlined operations.
- **Stakeholder Engagement:** The practice actively involves and promotes cooperation / coordination between key stakeholders in the TVET field.
